We look forward to celebrating all the wins with our students and families as we wrap up Spring 2022!



A Glimpse into Sierra's History

On the retaining wall just south of the front entrance of Sierra High School there is a brass plaque with the year "1935". Since that date is literally anchored in stone it is a good reference point, as the wall is nearly the same age as the construction date of what is now referred to as the "small gym."

For the entirety of my life the Prather family has lived just across the fence from the Qualls family. The three generations of Prather's who I have known have all pridefully told the story of their father, grandfather, or great grandfather having built the small gym at Sierra High School. I am in

full agreement with this assessment but when I read in one of the early yearbooks that the Works Progress Authority (WPA), which was part of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal Public Works Program, had built the small gym I did want to investigate.

If you go to page 2 of Volume I of the 1935 Sierra High yearbook you will find a picture of Mr. J.E. Prather. The yearbook was dedicated to Mr. Prather as a member of the Board of Trustees and someone who (showed unselfish interests in our welfare and progress during our school career.) This quote indicates his years of service even in 1935. A very good picture of the completed new gym also appears in this 1935 yearbook.


While the 1936 yearbook does not have a picture of the gym, the 1937 yearbook has a raft of pictures of the construction on both the east side with its iconic high-pitched roof and high rock work and the south end of the building that was extended for the stage and locker rooms. In the middle of these snap shots of construction Mr. Prather appears again in his work clothes with the caption (do you work here?). Quite obviously he did.

There are clues in the 1938 yearbook as to construction progress showing new roofs for seating along the west side of the building and a small kitchen. Seating for lunch was still provided on the gym floor.

In 1939 construction moved to the Administration, entrance, and classroom wings. This new construction now makes use of the retaining wall built in 1935. A snapshot here catches Mr. Prather having moved to "caretaker."

The last time that I find Mr. Prather in his caretaker garb is in the 1941 yearbook. That is also where I find a snapshot caption "new addition" showing completed construction on the north end of the gym that was to serve as the cafeteria for the high

school until a new cafeteria was built in 1948. The "mirror room" as it was named later continues to serve our students in a variety of ways.

So, these are some of the facts gleaned from early Sierra High yearbooks and a little bit of Prather family history. Do I have all of the information? Surely not! Have I misinterpreted some information, could be? Are there other sources of information? Maybe. So, if you can correct or add to my store of information, please give me a call.

The small gym has been important to Sierra High School for 87 years. It needs to continue to fill an important role for the foreseeable future. The core of the gym is still sound as I understand it. However, windows, roofs, and restrooms will need attention in the near future.

So, did Mr. J.E. Prather build the small gym? I think we can say that he did. The School Board recognized the need. They also recognized that they had someone sitting beside them who had the talent and passion to complete the project. This project would begin work with the design and oversight phase utilizing the Work Progress Authority and running through the last major addition to the gym in 1941.
